COUNCIL PRIORITIES**

SHORT TERM

- 1) **Get our basic city governance ABC's right:** a) functional city website so meeting notices, agendas & minutes can be properly posted and citizens have one place to get accurate information/ b) post notices and agendas on Friday before meetings to provide adequate time for review/ c) fix sound system-hybrid meeting system so minutes can be properly prepared –citizens can participate remotely/ d) update council rules to reflect these changes/ e) training or meetings for council and commission members to get everyone onto the same page and improve communication to avoid ill-will with our volunteers.
- 2) **Fix city water system:** Ensure that work on a) dredging permit and on b) metering system is proceeding as top priorities; c) finish work to buy Wilson land and d) work with Civil West on additional raw water projects.
- 3) **Ensure we have adequate staffing to provide city services:** including developing capacity for grant administration, enforcement of ordinances, etc.

LONG TERM

- 1) **Take a big picture look at water system—from watershed to sewer outfall, identify projects beyond the BRIC grant that may need urgent attention to tap once-in-a generation infrastructure funding opportunities:** such as sewer treatment plant upgrades. Continue with activities needed to assure water system is being improved, including seeking additional grants
- 2) **Improve and update planning, code, and fee structure: to address increasing development pressure and need for workforce housing –to conserve character of our community even as additional development occurs**
- 3) **Tap enthusiasm of community volunteers and increased city capacity for grant administration to accomplish projects that improve our community's livability and economy: such as renovating the community building, catalyzing a workforce housing project, other!**
